Grants:

Todd Ahlman (ANTH) has won a \$722,712 task order from the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers for support at multiple Midwest Region Air Force facilities. In addition, Dr. Ahlman has also received another task order for \$938,101 that includes archaeological surveys at the Utah Testing and Training Range.

Ty Schepis (PSY) has been awarded a Research Project Grant (R01) from the National Institute of Health (NIH). The three-year award of approximately \$573,000 is the first R01 grant to a Texas State faculty member since 1995.

Joe Falocco (ENG) has been awarded a National Endowment for the Humanities grant for \$63,000 in support of his "Teaching Shakespeare's Plays" project.

Nicole Taylor (ANTH) was awarded a nearly \$30,000 EAGER (Early-concept Grants for Exploratory Research) grant from the National Science Foundation for her project "Ethical and Methodological Challenges in Social Media Research."
